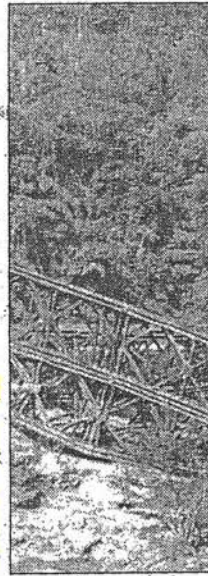
ERDF auditorium dedicated

Guwahati: Assam governor Jagdish Mukhi on Saturday appealed to the youth to become entrepreneurs and not run after jobs.

Speaking at the inauguration of the fifth edition of the North East Graduate Congress (NEGC) at the University of Science and Technology in Meghalaya's Ri Bhoi district, Mukhi said if youths become entrepreneurs, it will help the Northeast, Assam and the country.
