# **ABOUT USTM**

The University of Science & Technology, Meghalaya (USTM) sponsored by ERD Foundation, is the 1st Private University on Science & Technology in the entire North East, established with the basic motivation of encouraging the advancement, dissemination, development and application of knowledge. USTM, has a Curriculum & the provision of range of courses of study and research built up to meet the educational needs of this region.

USTM is established in an ideal & strategic location just one km from GS Road, Baridua, 9th Mile, Ri-Bhoi District of Meghalaya. It is only 6 kms from Guwahati and 85 kms from Shillong. The campus is well connected by Rail & Air which is only 15 kms Guwahati Railway Station & 48 kms from Guwahati International Airport.

The University of Science & Technology, Meghalaya has been established under the provisions of the University of Science & Technology, Meghalaya Act (No.6 of 2008) enacted by the Legislative Assembly of Meghalaya and notified vide Gazette Notification No. LL (B) 87/2008/21, dated 02.12.2008 of Government of Meghalaya. USTM is empowered by University Grants Commission to award degrees as specified under Section 22 of UGC Act, 1956.

USTM has received the following approvals from highest statutory bodies of Government of India-




### **USTM STRUCTURE OF GOVERNANCE**






# **GROWTH OF STUDENTS IN LAST 3 YEARS**




# **GROWTH OF HUMAN RESOURCE IN LAST 3 YEARS**




# **UG Admission Status for last 3 years**






PG Admission Status for last 3 years







# **Growth of Enrollment of Students from Meghalaya**


# Category Wise Distribution of Enrolled Students of USTM



**Total number of Students including Research Scholar = 2213** 





# **On-Campus Bookshops**






