

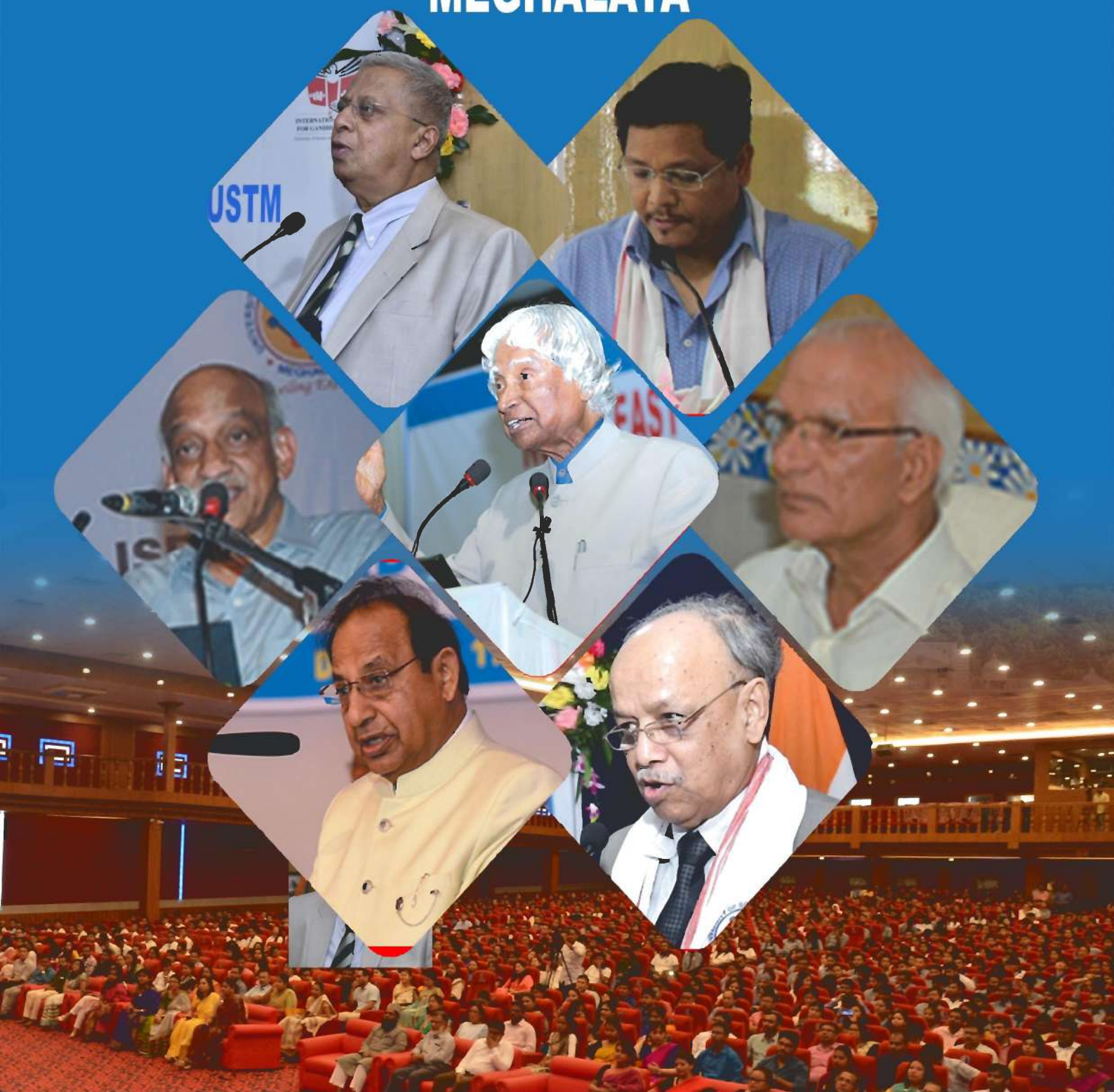

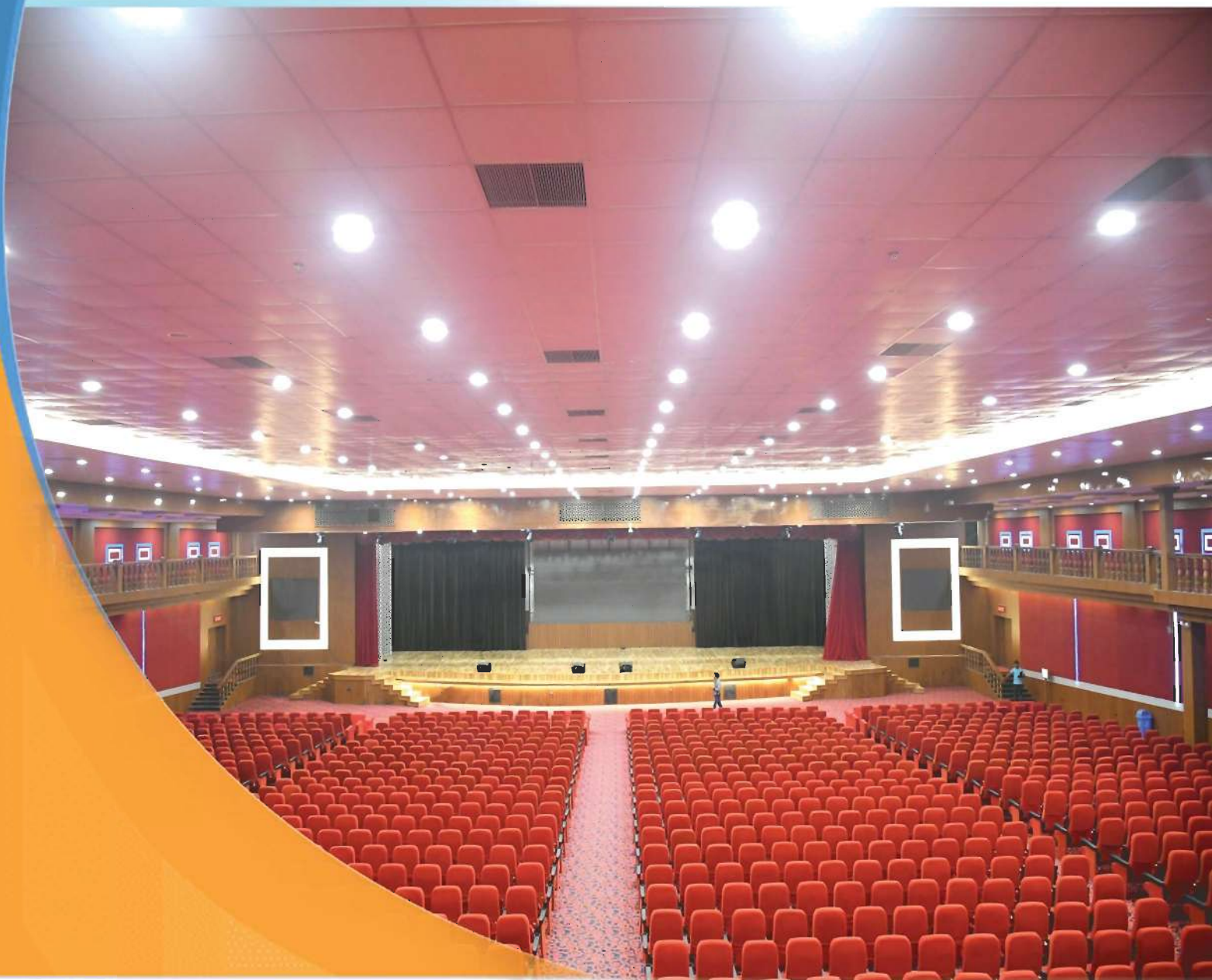

## USTM : An Overview

The University of Science & Technology, Meghalaya (USTM) is the most emerging and first self-financed science and technology university in the entire north-eastern part of India, promoted by ERD Foundation, Guwahati. It has been established under the provision of an enactment made by the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly under Act No.6 of 2008 notified vide Gazette Notification No. LL(B) 87/2008/21, dated 02.12.2008 of Government of Meghalaya. The University is empowered by the University Grants Commission to award degrees as specified under Section 22 of UGC Act, 1956. USTM has also received necessary approval from AICTE, New Delhi, BCI, PCI & NCTE, ERC, Bhubaneswar to run MBA, BALLB, LLB, B. Pharma and B.Ed. courses respectively. USTM is a Member of Association of Indian Universities and Member of the Association of Commonwealth Universities. USTM is located in picturesque landscape surrounded by tranquil greenery in the Assam-Meghalaya border, 6 kms from Dispur, the capital of Assam and 85 kms from Shillong, the capital of Meghalaya state and is well connected by road, rail and air transport.

With more than two years of focused study on the educational needs of the region by leading Academicians, Scientists and a group of Vice Chancellors and educational administrators of the region, USTM has started its systematic academic process in September 2011. The University is dedicated to the cause of high quality science and technology education and advanced research in frontier and cutting edge. Here innovation, invention and entrepreneurship remain the cardinal focus and thrust. Facilities are being offered with this long term goal with special focus on the Science and Technology needs of this region. Creating the best graduates who can think, innovate and invent would remain the all time driving force of USTM. The University would direct all its efforts to create the needed Science and Technology manpower to foster relentlessly the economic and social development of the region in an inclusive manner.

At Present USTM offers varied and content rich programmes focused on the educational needs of the region and has a multi-disciplinary approach.

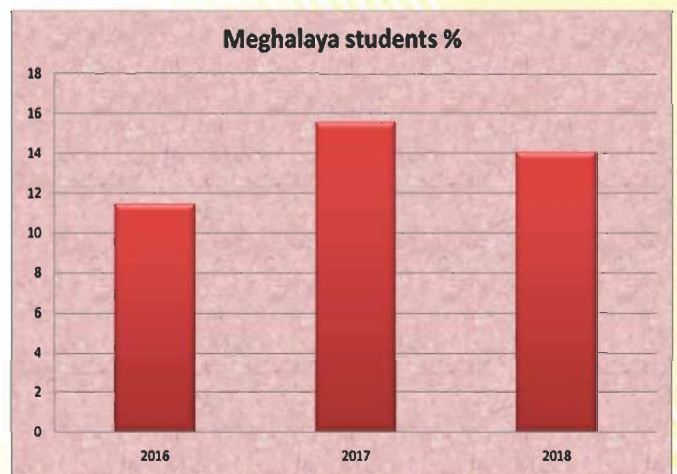

### State wise Students Enrollment (Last 3 yrs)

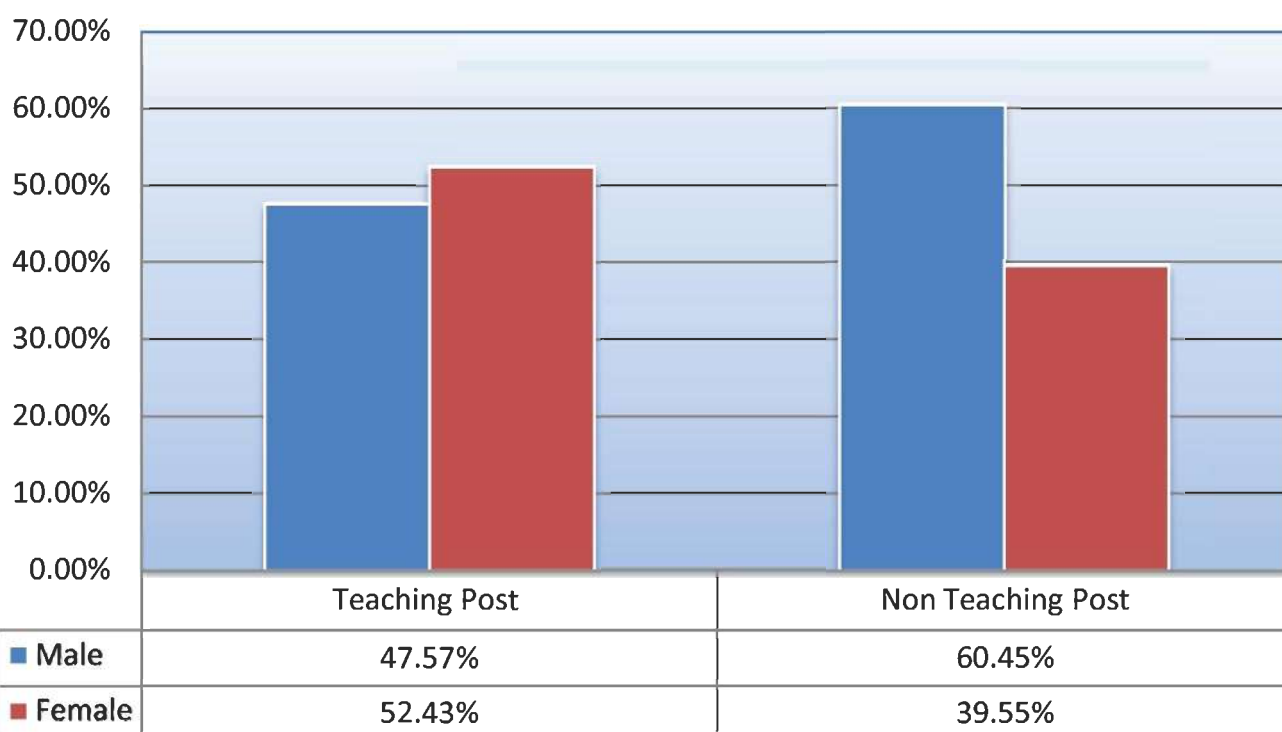




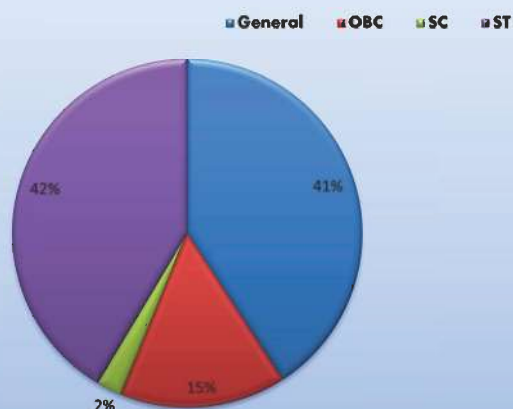

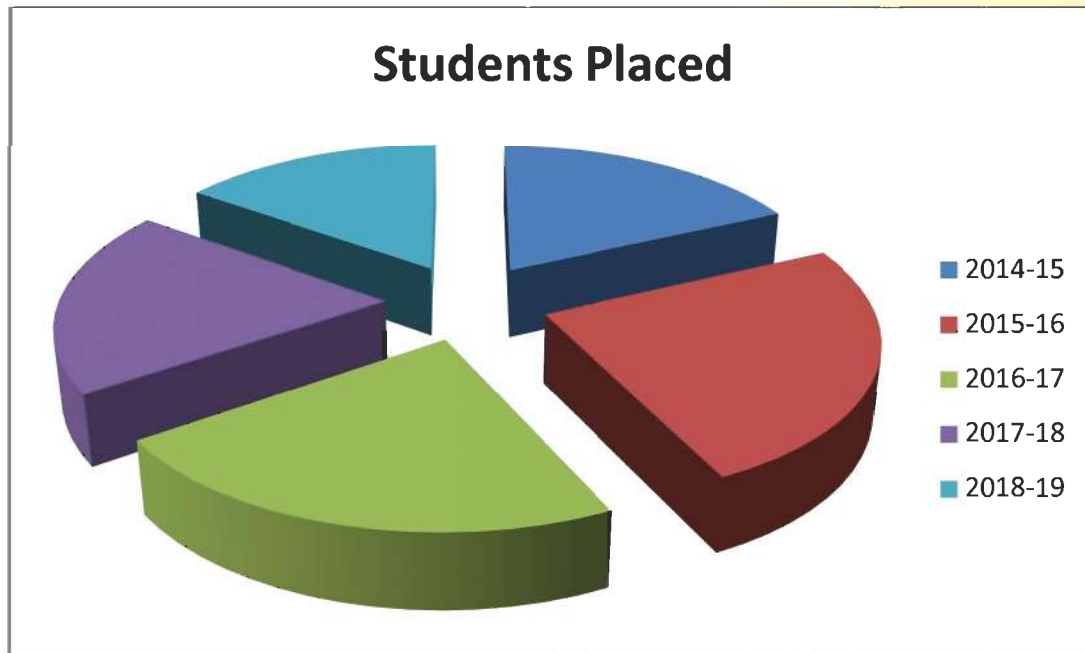

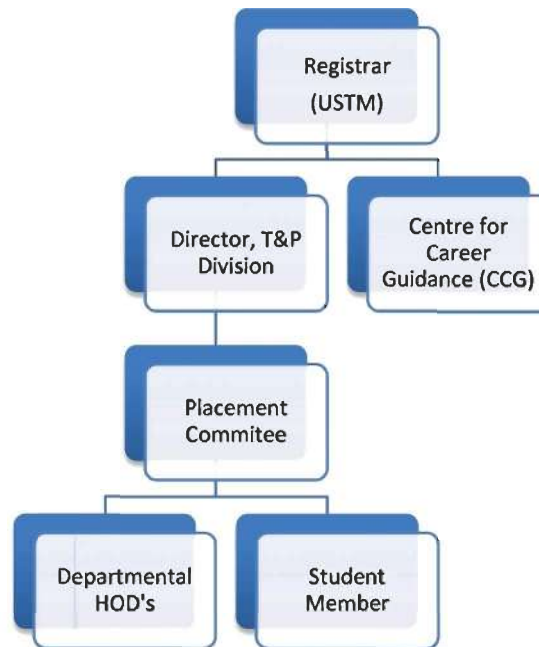

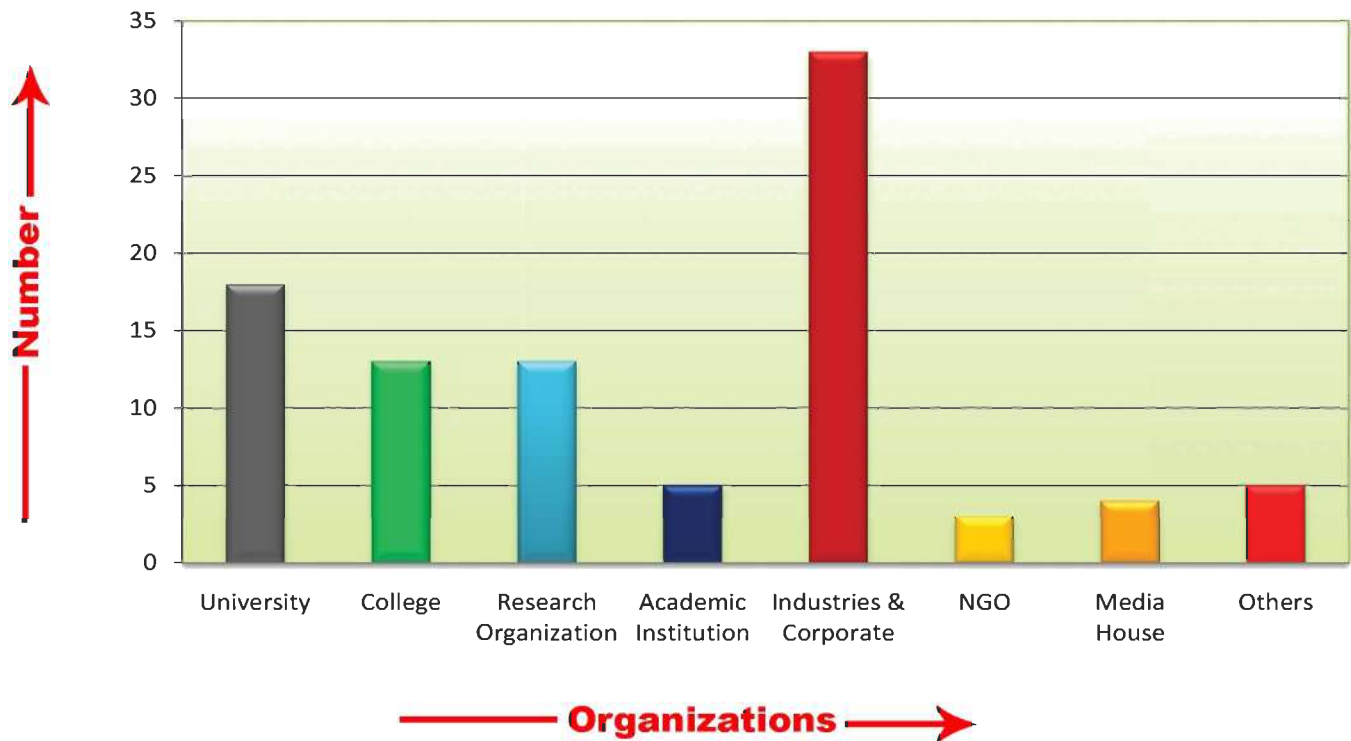

On 30 January 2018: With the objective to create greater public awareness of the importance of human rights to the lives of people, the Meghalaya Human Rights Commission (MHRC) organized an ‘Awareness Programme on Human Rights’ at University of Science and Technology, Meghalaya in association with the University School of Law and Research here was addressed by Dr. Justice Aftab Hussain Saikia, Chairperson, MHRC; P.J.P. Hanaman, Member, MHRC; Noor Khan, District Session Judge, Ri Bhoi and West Jaintia Hills; Baharun Saikia, Advocate, Gauhati High Court.

A 7-days-long national level workshop and training on Microbiology and Immunology was conducted by Dept of Applied Biology, USTM from 4 to 10 February, 2018. 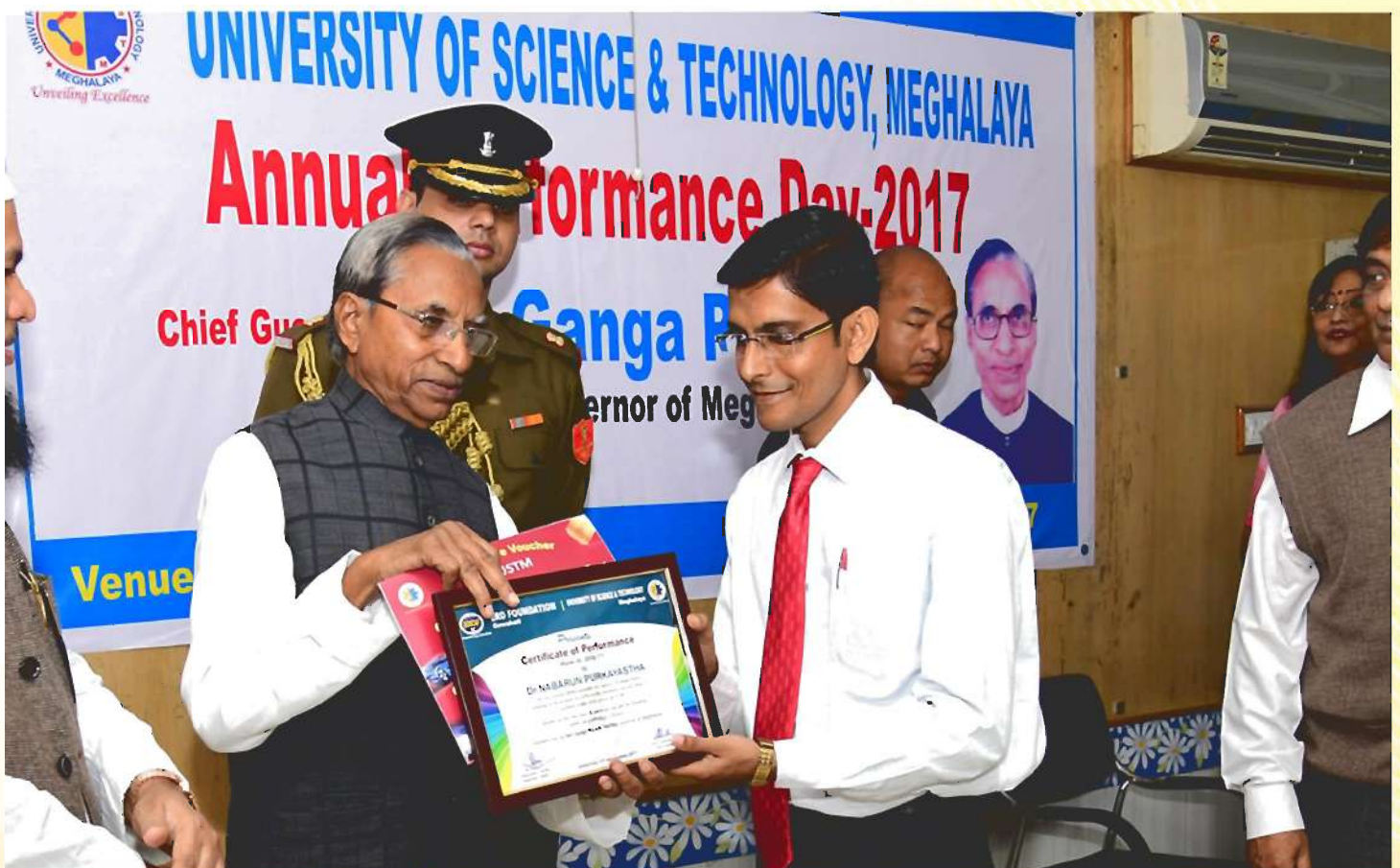

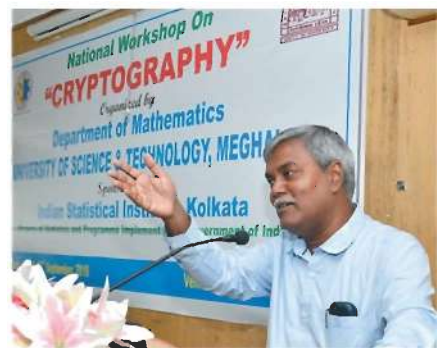
## Neighborhood Development Mission

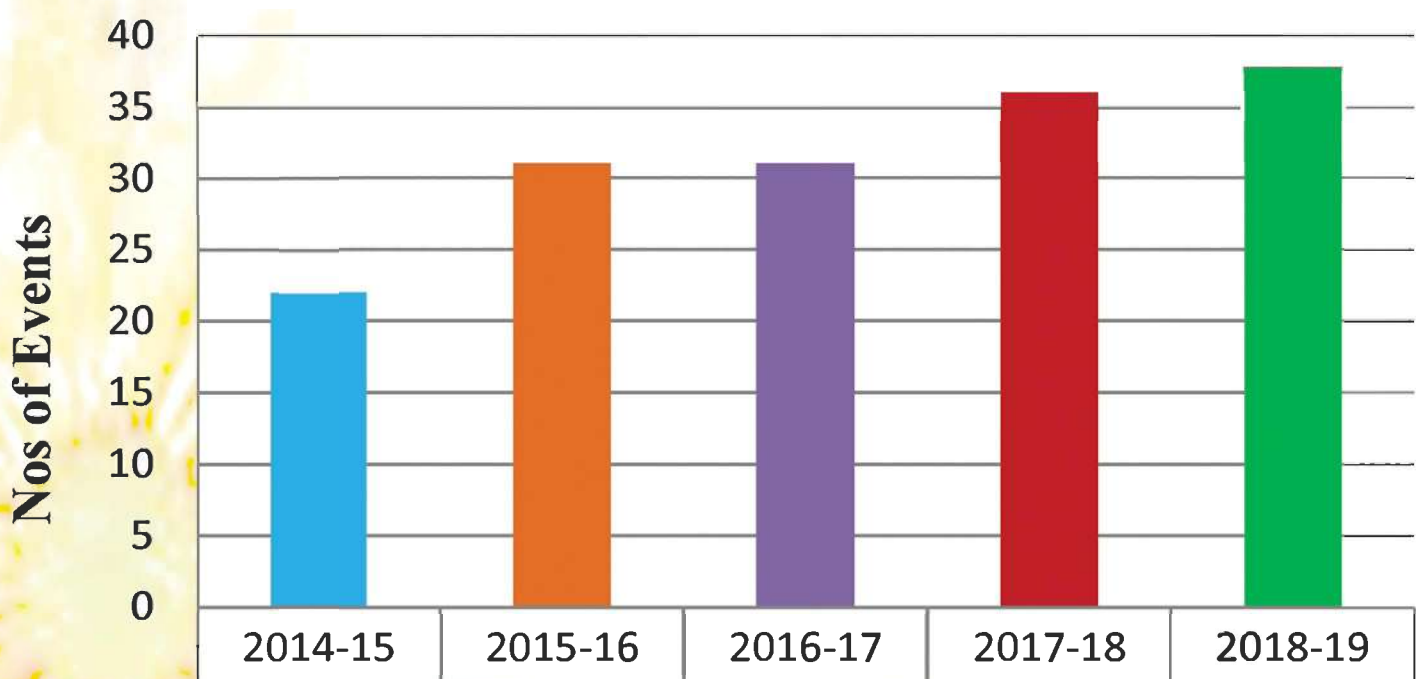
