Women's Day functions held in city

GUWAHATI, March 9: In celebration of International Women's Day, an awareness programme was organised at Khanapara on Monday morning and it was followed by a session on the occasion at Hatigaon in the afternoon. Around 100 women from the neighbourhood attended the programme. The Minister for Women's Affairs, who was the chief guest, was speaking in the field of women's empowerment and implementation of various schemes of the government. The NGO's activities were highlighted by Najma Heptullah, Minister for Minority Affairs. During her recent visit to Assam, she was felicitated at the interactive session on Tuesday. Sahiba Bhandari, founder director of the organisation exhorted the women to stand as one against the evil practices and superstitions prevailing in the society. She urged the ladies to stand up bravely against the dowry during

weddings and against the practice of preferential treatment given to boys in comparison to the girl child in many Indian families.

In his address as the chief guest, Nurul Laskar, chief adviser to the Public Relations Society of India (PRSI) Guwahati Chapter, cleared many misconceptions about the position of women in the Muslim society.

"The first person to embrace Islam from the Prophet was a woman and not a man. She was Khadijah, who was the Prophet's wife. Similarly, Allah has appointed a woman, Fatima as the custodian of the heaven and not any man," he said, adding that it is through learning and attaining economic independence that a woman can find a place of honour in the family and society. Samina Adil, senior coordinator of the NGO and Mahbulul Hoque, Chancellor, USTM, also addressed the gathering.

The Hengrabari Housing Colony Mahila Samaj also organised a discussion on equal status for women in keeping with the United Nation's theme 'Planet 50:50 by 2030.'

Meghalaya, March 1: University of Science and Technology, Meghalaya (USTM) celebrated the National Science Day with day-long activities on February 28, 2013. Dr. D N Buragohain, the Founder Director of IIT, Guwahati and present Chancellor, Nagaland University was the Chief Guest for the occasion and Dr. N K Choudhury former V C, Gauhati University and Principal Advisor to ERD Foundation presided over the function. Also present in the occasion were the Chancellor of USTM Shri M. Hoque, Vice Chancellor (Acting), Dr R K Sharma, Deans of various Schools, faculty members and students of the University.

During his deliberation Dr. Buragohain stressed on accepting "change" he said, "We have to change according to the rapid scientific developments and accept the changes or else we will fall".

Further speaking on how the human race has become dependent on technology he said, "It is said that necessity is the mother of invention but now things are created before the need arises and sometimes the need is created for certain products". Encouraging the students to think out of the box and understand the concept of new scientific developments he said, "You should not think traditionally". He asked them to go out of a situation or concept to understand it properly and objectively.

Presiding over the session Dr. N K Choudhury congratulated the university authorities for observing National Science Day and the way they organised it. Paying his homage to the great scientist Dr. C V Raman he said, "Dr. Raman invented the Raman Effect in 1928 and won the Nobel Prize in 1930 and since then for almost hundred years

no scientific invention from India made a mark in the Nobel Prize".
