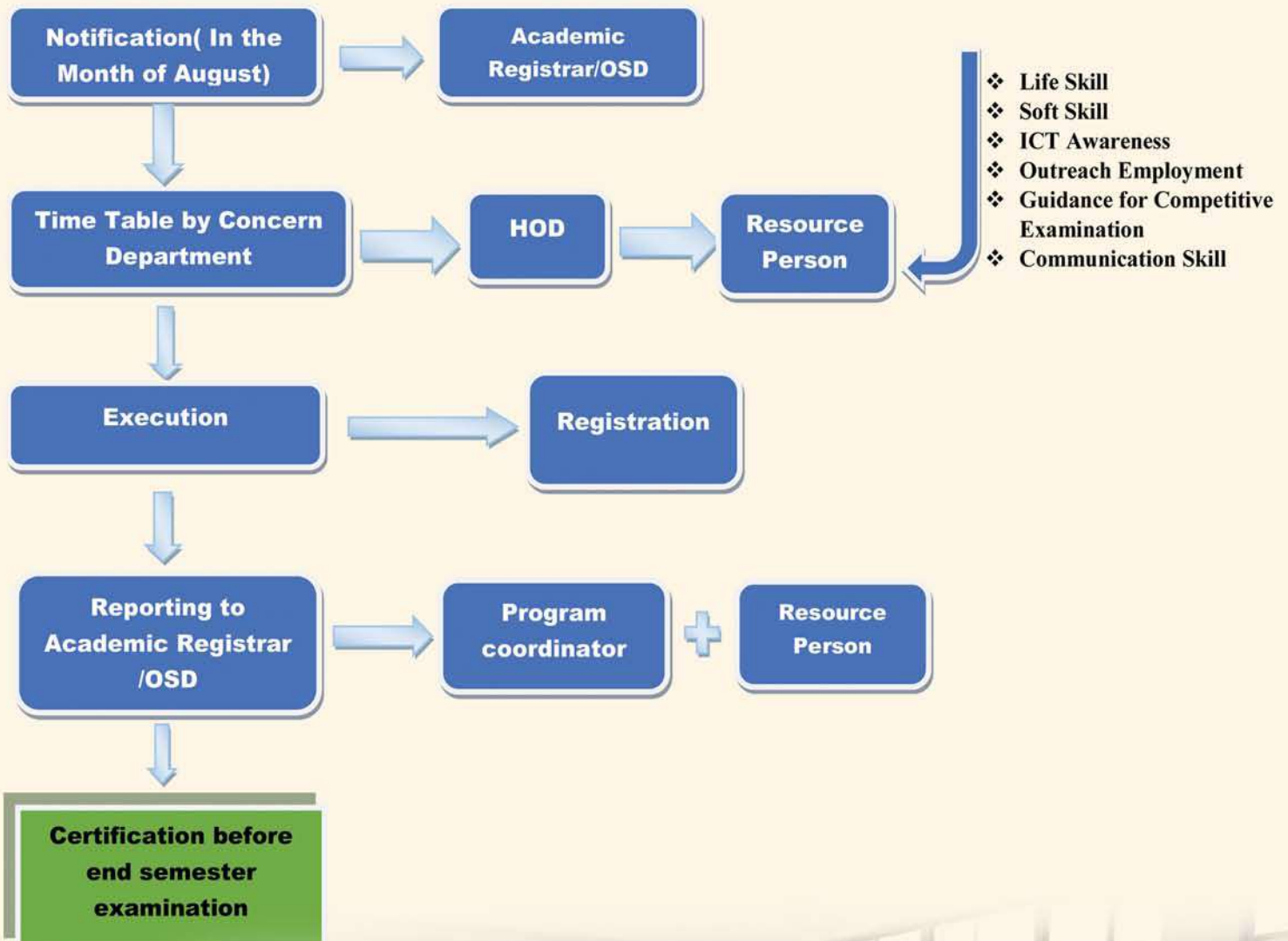

SHILLONG, AUG 24: The University of Science and Technology, Meghalaya (USTM) organised an orientation programme for its third batch of students for the new academic year 2013 in the University. The inauguration session of the day-long programme was graced by Justice I. A. Anant, Judge, Gauhati High Court; Prof. Amarjyoti Choudhury, Pro-VC, Tezpur University; Prof. K. Ishmail, Deputy Director, IIT, Guwahati and Shri Sandip Nair, DGM (Marketing), Dalmia Cement.

Justice Anant, in his welcome address, said, "The distinguished guests students on 'contribution of interdependence, independent of the others.' Prof. Choudhury lamented the lack of entrepreneurship in society. Citing examples, he said, '...connect to the students to '...weak and will ultimately drag you down. He asked the students to be independent and to generate ideas. 'And if new ideas are generated, which is lacking in our educational system in the present day context Prof. Choudhury further said, 'Society, for the last three decades there has been no single contribution from India in the field of science and hence no Nobel Prize has been won by an Indian.' In his speech Prof. Sukumar Nandi gave the students useful tips on how to succeed in life.

Wheel power: USTM opens driving school for women

GUWAHATI: A driving school for women has been launched here on Wednesday by the University of Science & Technology, Meghalaya (USTM) as a part of its outreach initiatives.

Named 'USTM Women's Driving School' an Outreach Initiative of ERDF, course for the school will include both practical and theory classes that will equip a woman to become a professional.

The programme will begin from today with enrolment of students. We are recruiting efficient lady instructors for the training. Classes will begin from March 15, said Prof. Manojit Barua, Chancellor of USTM and Chairman of ERDF Foundation, Guwahati. Students who are school drop outs, widows and single mothers will be given preference. Meghal Bora, who is the Managing Director of a city based driving institute, will be the trainer.

The course offered by USTM includes five stages. There will be orientation classes for three-day classes that will be followed by hands-on practical lessons by female trainers for ten days. This will be followed by ten days of training on communication skill, aptitude and professional. Then there will be practical classes for five days. There will be 200 marks will be taken. After that, USTM will also award a certificate for the students who complete the course. The award will help the students in their job.
