





It has to build a close linkage with the universities, specially those who are more focused on research activities in the field of science and technology so that more information on different applications and space technologies that ISRO is undertaking can be made available in the public sphere.

It was sharp 12 pm and people driving the scorching heat started swarming at USTM

campus to be a witness to a historical moment. The lecture was inaugurated by the welcome address by Mahbubul Hoque, Chancellor of USTM. for the development and welfare of the society starting from disaster management to satellite communication to forecasting activities etc.







JORABAT, June 23: A galaxy of Vice Chancellors of North Eastern universities, educational directors and representatives of educational institutions from the NE region gathered at the University of Science & Technology, Meghalaya (USTM) here today to participate in a brainstorming session on the National Education Policy-2019.

They discussed the massive changes and restructuring of the existing education system. The programme was organised by the USTM in association with the Centre for South East Asian Studies, Gauhati University, and the International University, Arunachal Pradesh.

Presiding over the meet, Prof Mihir Kanti Chaudhuri, Adviser (Education), Government of Assam, said that one of the important points agreed to by all the participants was that the new National




