IQAC REPORT With the exposure of our University to the NAAC assessment process we have become aware of the various areas of improvement in the several academic as well as non-academic activities conducted by the University. We also identified better ways to streamline the activities done as per the guidelines and expectations of NAAC. For academic year 22-23 we have laid down process for carrying out the activities and capturing the documentations in a manner that nothing gets left out while planning an activity. The documentation to be captured have been laid out as per the NAAC SOP and at the time of doing the activity, the documentation is to be submitted to the IQAC office for review and archiving. Our IQAC officers attached to each department monitor and guide the departmental activities for professional execution. IQAC conducts intermittent meetings with the departments to keep driving their focus on the width and depth of execution standards. As a strategy, we have agreed to improve the accreditation grade every cycle and continually keep improving the academic and non-academic benchmarks we adopt. Developing Graduate Attributes & implementation of Outcome-Based Education: The Graduate attributes emphasizing on holistic learning have been developed to transform the promising youngsters into leaders of tomorrow with globally relevant, future-ready and actionable intelligence. Every graduate of the University will be developed to possess the following attributes

Program Educational Objectives of each program are based on the four Graduate Attributes defined by the University for the Holistic Development of the students. The objectives of the IQAC are to ensure continuous improvement in the entire operations of the Institution, to ensure stakeholders connected with Education, namely parents, teachers, staff, employers, funding agencies, and society in general, of its own quality and probity and to develop a quality system for conscious, consistent, and programmed action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution. It also promotes measures for driving institutional functioning towards quality enhancement and institutionalization of best practices. During the assessment process for NAAC accreditation, the University felt a few areas wherein we need to work in a more synchronous manner and more organized manner. One was the departmental activity monitoring and the other was documentation and retrieval of proof of activity. The NAAC manual has been a guiding document in this matter. Deployment of IQAC Charters for every academic session: We need to further regulate and monitor the activities of the departments for a holistic execution as per the NAAC manual. Realizing this we developed a charter of activities to be done by the faculties individually and by the department as a whole. On similar lines, we also carved out the charter of activities for the various centres and administrative functional heads. These charters are reviewed periodically.

IQAC Archive for activity documentation upload and retrieval:

We developed web software wherein the faculty members and departmental coordinators can create the documentation on the archive and upload the requisite documents for review and storage. IQAC reviewed the uploaded documents and approved for storage. Prior to the submission of AQAR, we can retrieve the documents from the archive and upload to the NAAC portal. Faculty Development Programs were held under IQAC Initiatives. The objectives of the Faculty Development Program are to sensitize the faculty about the importance of IQAC & Enabling faculty to efficiently used Tech tools for innovation in education. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of institutions. For this, during the post-accreditation period, it will channelize all efforts and measures of the institution towards promoting its holistic academic excellence. The guidelines provided in the following pages will guide and facilitate the institution in the creation and operation of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The work of the IQAC is the first step towards internalization and institutionalization of quality enhancement initiatives. Its success depends upon the sense of belongingness and participation it can inculcate in all the constituents of the institution. It will not be yet another hierarchical structure or a record-keeping exercise in the institution. It will be a facilitative and participative voluntary system/unit/organ of the institution. 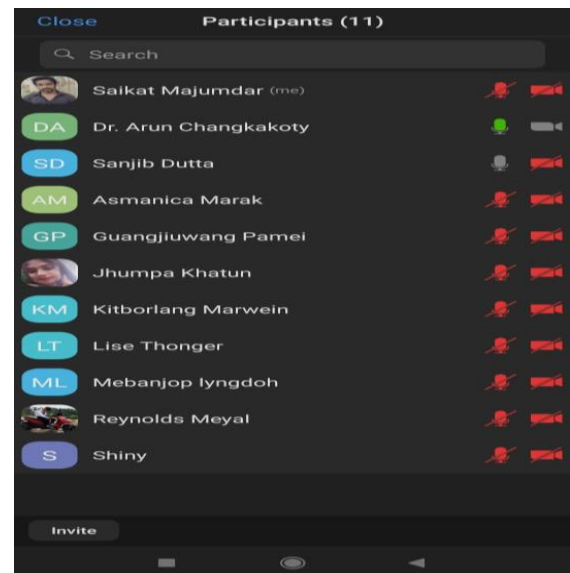

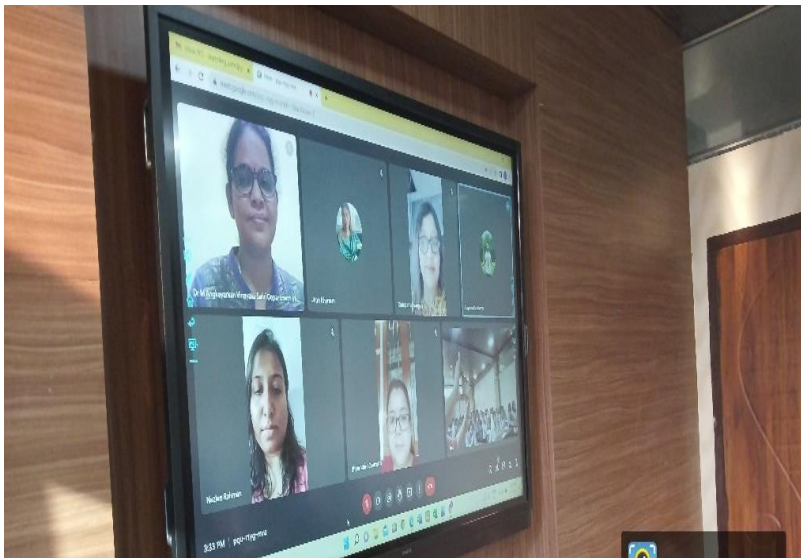

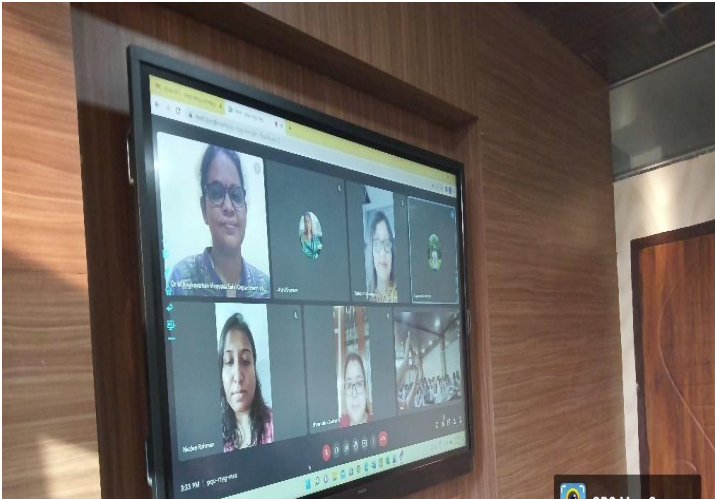

Workshop on 'Quality Practices for Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Prevention' held

GUWAHATI: A workshop on "Quality Practices for Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Prevention" was held today at the Conference Hall of the Administrative Block. The workshop was organised by the PQH School of Education, USTM, in collaboration with State Level Coordinating Agency (SLCA), Drug Prevention for Assam and Meghalaya. It has been supported by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India and NISD, NSS Cell of USTM. Prof GD Sharma, Vice Chancellor of USTM, delivered the welcome speech and encouraged the students to understand the issue of substance abuse. A pre-evaluation form was circulated among the students by

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE CONSTITUTED FOR CONDUCTING
ACADEMIC & ADMINISTRATIVE AUDIT FOR USTM for the year 2022-23

The USTM constituted the following committee for conducting AAA during 23-24 June, 2023.

Dr. Debasish Saha, Director, IQAC and Dr. Monalisha Deka, Jt. Director, IQAC of USTM has assisted the committee as co-ordinator(s).

The detailed schedule of interaction/visit, discussion with various stakeholders and functionaries on 23rd and 24th June, 2023 is attached herewith Annexure A.

Scheme of Visit:

The deliberations started with a presentation by the Vice-Chancellor giving an overall view of the University, and the Pro- Vice Chancellor, Adviser, Deans and other administrative functionaries of the University attended during the presentation followed by the visit to select departments of the University across departments and indepth deliberations with them. The committee also interacted with the Registrar, Controller of Examinations, Librarian, Innovation centre and students apart from the visit to the facilities.

The committee concentrated on the improvement that has occurred after the NAAC assessment exercise conducted in 2021. The overall impressions and recommendations are summarised in this Report.

General observations

The Committee appreciates the University for progress made after obtaining respectable NAAC grading in its first assessment. The overall impression of the Committee is positive.

Few observations are made as below:

- Student's enrolment has substantially increased from 3500 to 6000 in the University (but not uniform across departments). There by the student: teacher ratio has reached optimal.
- Students' diversity from across Northeast states is visible across departments
- Recent alumni of the University have been carrying good impressions of the University and they are contributing to the students' enrolment
- Faculty members are found to have clarity in their expressions
- The average age of the faculty members ranges between 35 to 40 years across the departments and augur well for the future (retention of faculty will be a challenge).
- It is clearly visible that research output has increased across all departments particularly in sciences after NAAC accreditation. Also good number of patent applications has been filed by the University and some granted.
- Publications and citations from the faculty have substantially increased but it is not uniform across departments.
- Students are keen learners as observed during the interactions with them even though many of them are first generation learners.
- Students' are happy to attend classes and rigorous monitoring of attendance is appreciated by them.

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- Class room teaching-learning process is appreciable.
- Mentor-mentee system has shown advantages across departments.
- Placement activity shows positive trends in few departments.
- Target setting by the way of charter by the department for themselves has showed positive results.
- Administrative process of the University is found to be adequate.
- Library is automated and usages among the students and faculty are appreciable.
- Result declaration process of the University is appreciated. Student's grievances of evaluation process seem very minimal.
- Infrastructure facilities of the University are outstanding.
- IQAC is well staffed with good working space.
- The vision of the founder has left a mark on the rapid development of the University till date.
- Vicinity to Guwahati city has added value to the University.

Recommendations:

Apart from the recommendations made by the PTR of NAAC (which is in the process of implementation by the University) the following additional issues may be considered:

- Efforts needed to increase collaborative research (intra and inter University) with emphasis on publications in UGC recognised journals
- Faculty across departments need to be oriented for undertaking major research projects with funding from various sources
- Emphasis need to be made for initiating post-doctoral fellowships in different departments and the PDF scholars may be give the responsibility of part time teaching
- Technology up-gradation and adaptation need to be fast track along with emphasis of training to faculty and students
- The University website needs more attention as part of the concept of brand building
- To make students globally competitive courses in foreign languages need to be introduced phasewise
- Soft skills among students need to be strengthened, e.g. confidence level, public speaking, inter phasing with technology, widening mindsets for looking up to opportunities across India and abroad
- The policy formulation to support highly deserving students financially for their internship outside Northeast India need to be looked into
- Review of Quality policy at specific intervals
- Collaborations/learning tours to other Universities across India where process maturity has been achieved particularly in connection with IQAC, Examination wing, library etc.
- The University may formulate a policy to transform (as per NEP 2020 guidelines) to be MERU (Multidisciplinary Education and Research University)
- Networking across board by ther University faculties as a concept to be taken up and guidelines formulated
- To create policy on inducting professionals as "Professor of Practice" in different departments as per UGC guidelines
- The periodic student satisfaction survey along with exit interview of outgoing students

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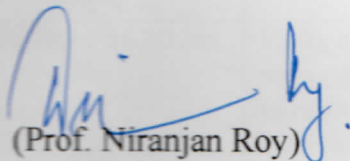
- Exit interview for the faculty leaving the University may be conducted regularly
- Library may be strengthened in to a information sharing Unit of the University along with regular activities.
- University has completed more than a decade of its existence, a work study need to be conducted on the processes and the system being developed in the University overtime to eliminate redundancy and bring efficiency. Time management in the functioning of the University may be a part of the study.

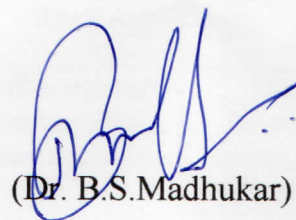
