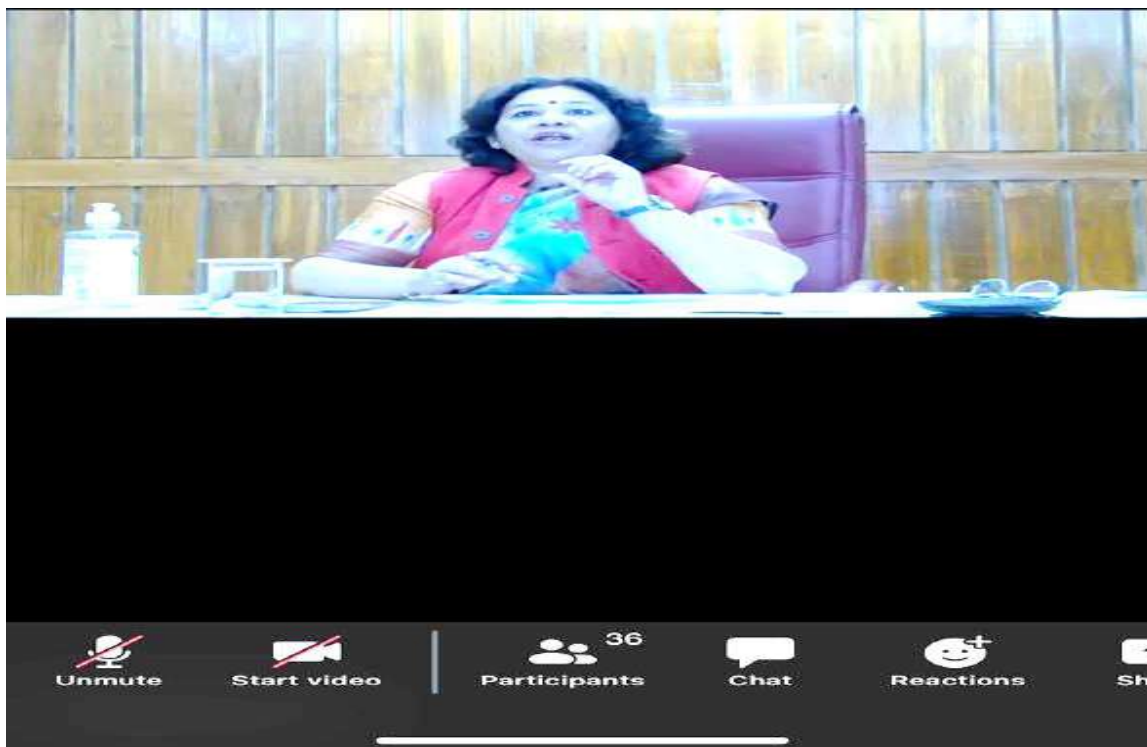

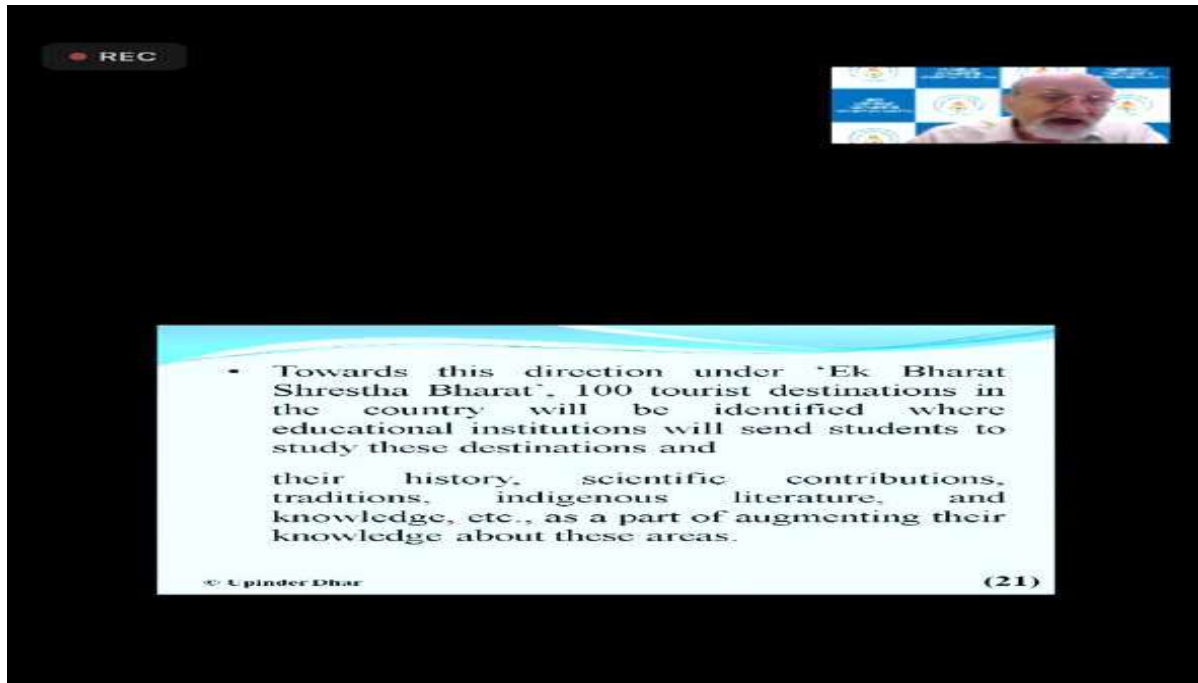

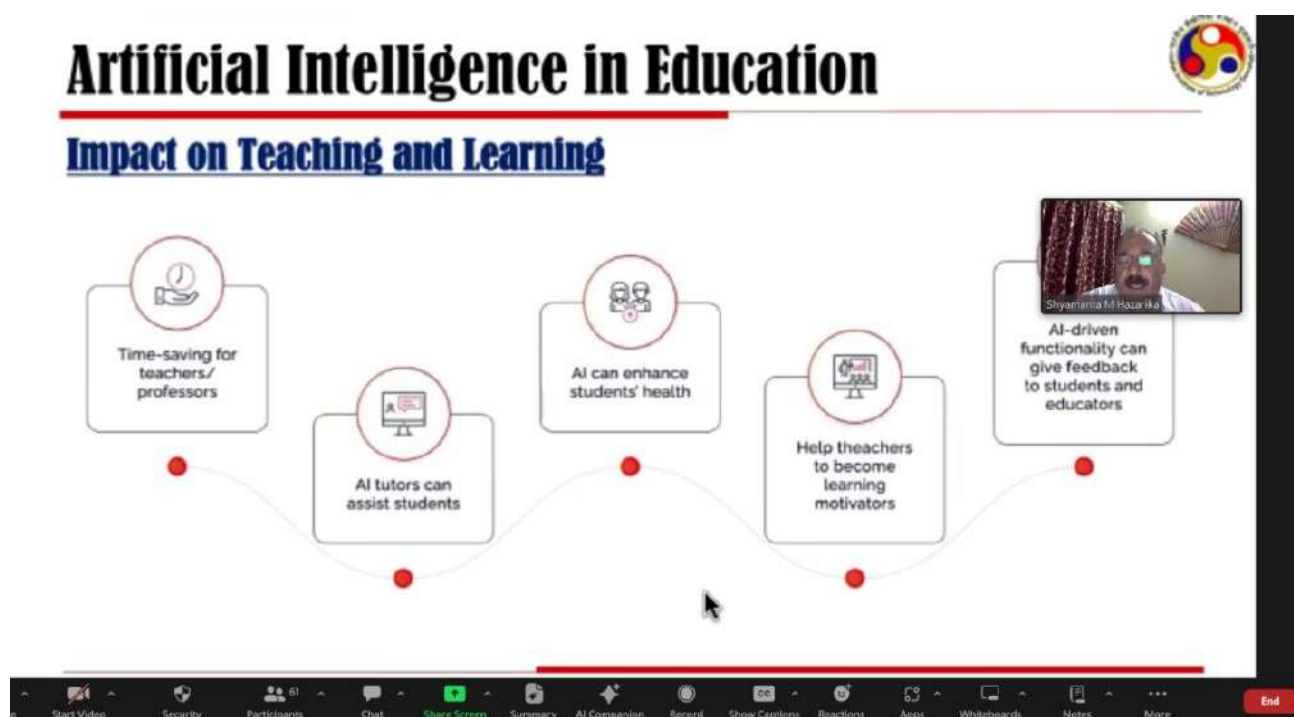


Fig 1: Day 1 online session

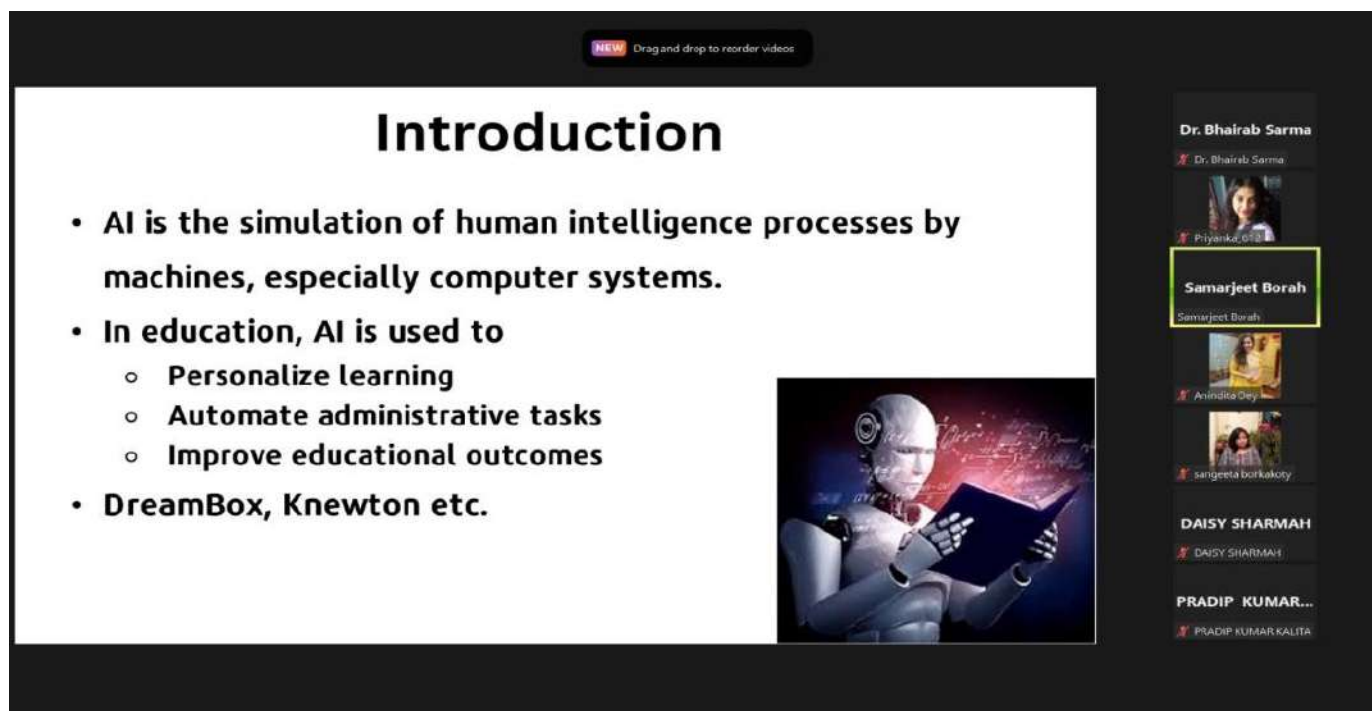


Fig 5: Day 5 online session

Week-long Capacity Development Programme held by AIU-USTM-AADC

9TH MILE, Khanapara, Ri Bhoi, MAY 27: A week-long Capacity Development Programme on the theme "Catalyzing Academic Reforms through Capacity Building of Universities Administration" was organized by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU)-USTM-AADC (University of Science and Technology Meghalaya Academic and Administrative Development Centre) from 20th to 25th May 2024 in collaboration with the department of Rural Development USTM. Held in online mode, the inaugural of the program was addressed by Prof. G.D. Sharma, Vice Chancellor, USTM and President, AIU; Dr. Pankaj Mittal, Secretary General of AIU; Dr. B.L. Ahuja, Vice Chancellor, Bodoland University, Kokrajhar, Assam and Dr. Rajul K. Gajjar, Vice Chancellor, Gujarat Technological University.

The five key speakers who addressed the webinar include Dr. P. G. Rao, Distinguished Scientist CSIR,

Faculty members from diverse regions across India, including Indore, Maharashtra, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, and various parts of Assam such as Duli-jan, Silchar, Bongaigaon, Mangaldai, and Hajo, participated in the event, alongside faculty members from USTM.

The inaugural session was honored by the presence of esteemed individuals including Prof. Pralhad R.
